2024 Winter Olympics Returns to Salt Lake

After 32 years, Salt Lake is set to host the Winter Games again. The city is preparing to be one of the greenest Olympic hosts, revitalizing 2002 venues that have remained active since the last Games.

The NHL's newest team just finished its debut season, hitting the ice at the Delta Center—the same arena that the NBA's Utah Jazz call home.

New International Airlift

Delta Air Lines launched Salt Lake's first nonstop flight to Asia with service to Seoul on June 12, 2025. WestJet offers seasonal flights from Edmonton from May–Oct, and Aeroméxico adds daily winter service from Monterrey, Dec 18–Jan 4, 2026.

Temple Square Restoration Nearing Completion

The Salt Lake Temple will reopen for a ticketed public open house from April to October 2027, ahead of its rededication. The Garden Restaurant at Temple Square in the Joseph Smith Building reopens on June 30, 2025.

Rocky Mountaineer Expands to Salt Lake

The luxury rail service will launch a new 3-day Canyon Spirit route connecting Moab to Salt Lake starting in April through November 2026.

Asher Adams Hotel Now Open

The newly opened 225-room Asher Adams is the fifth hotel to debut in Salt Lake in the last 3 years, joining the Hyatt Regency, Le Méridien, Element, and the evo Hotel. Together, these additions have brought more than 1,200 new rooms to the city's expanding hotel inventory.

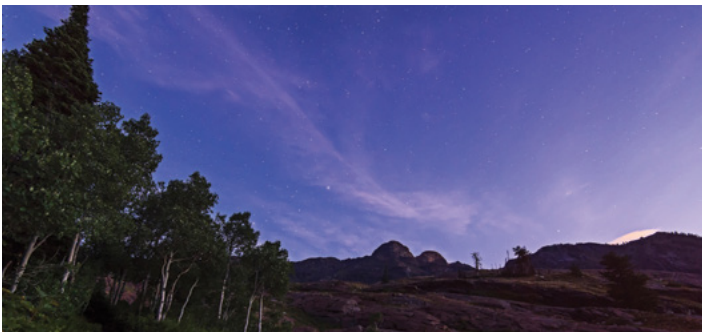
